2. Windows - Copy and Save Option

In Windows, if you need to **copy and save any part/portion of a screen that you are viewing**, here is a quick and easy method.

* Press and hold WIN KEY+SHIFT+S then let go. (this is the



WIN KEY)

- * A window at the top of your screen will appear with the 'rectangular option' highlighted.
- * Hold down LEFT MOUSE BUTTON and drag to create a shape around the portion of the screen that you want to save, then let go.
- * That image will appear in the right corner of your screen, then left click that image.
- * The image will now appear in a new window that will allow a number of options.
- * To CROP, click the icon () and adjust size.
- * Press ENTER when finished making adjustments.

In the top right of the screen an icon will be shown to SAVE () the image to whatever location you choose.
