If you missed my the email earlier this month regarding an important update for GOOGLE CHROME it is repeated over the page.

Alan Carter had this important message for our members.

'If you use Google Chrome as an internet browser it is recommended that you do an urgent update due to several high risk security issues that can be exploited by cyber criminals. The update process is easy.

1. Open Chrome Browser

2. Click the 3 vertical dots in the top right corner

3. Click HELP then select ABOUT GOOGLE CHROME - If an update is needed it will start automatically.'
