#### Something from Alan Carter

I was reading an article about a 56 year old driver with a 38 years blemish-free record who decided to have a mock driving test to see if any bad habits had developed over the years.

Here are some that the instructor noted:

1. Taking hands off the steering wheel while stopped at traffic lights- Instant Fail

2. Steering with one elbow resting on the centre console or on window ledge - Instant Fail

3. Not having both hands on steering wheel at ALL times unless changing gear on a manual car - Instant Fail

4. Instructor commented there were 19 other 'Instant Fail' items including 'disobeying traffic signs or road markings', 'failing to give way', 'exceeding the speed limit', 'not parking to the required standard'.

5. In NSW a driver has to score 90% or higher with no 'fail items' which does not allow a huge margin for error.

6. Point can be lost for not completing 'over the shoulder' checks, relying instead on the mirrors and 'blind spot monitoring' with merges not forgetting 'signalling errors'.

7. Parallel Parking between cars can result in test points loss for 'angle of entry', 'closeness to kerb', 'perfect parking should be done in 3 manoeuvres but testing allows for a 4th'.

No doubt, none of us would be guilty of ANY of the above points but just to be sure I am considering a mock test myself.

PS: Don't know why I just bought a new car that does all these 'blind spot monitoring checks' and 'lane control', 'collision avoidance with auto braking' automatically for me!
